

MORIWAKI shakes down the MORIWAKI MD600 at Suzuka Circuit South Course

On Friday, 15th May 2009, MORIWAKI shakes down the MORIWAKI MD600 at Suzuka Circuit South Course, a short track which lay next to the international racing track.

The purpose of testing was to evaluate and see the basic potential of the MD600, the third proto-type, an aluminum main frame, which was introduced during the World Championship Round 2 POLINI Grand Prix of Japan 2009.

Checking the basic functions of each part of the chassis, the menu was formed to check and confirm its reliability and its potential. MD600, a moto2 proto-type, was ridden by Shogo Moriwaki, and consumed over 40 positive laps.

Despite the fact that this was MORIWAKI's first testing with the third proto-type, it did not take long to confirm that the direction of development was heading toward the right direction.

Studying the test results, MORIWAKI will continue to develop the bike to bring it up to a higher level.
